



**Example of functions**: Let  $f: I \to I$  be defined as  $f(x) = x^2 \forall x \in I$ . This is a function.

#### Remarks:

- 1. A function f from a set A to the real numbers R is called a *real valued function*.
- 2. Let  $f: A \rightarrow B$  be a function and f(a) = b,  $a \in A$ ,  $b \in B$ . Then b is said to be image of a, and a is called the pre-image of b.

**Domain & Range of a function**: Let  $f: A \to B$  be a function. Then A is called the Domain of f and  $f(A) = \{f(a) \mid a \in A\}$  is called the Range of f. The set B is called the co-domain of f.

**Remark**: If the domain and co-domain of a function f are both the same set, say A, then f is called an operator or transformation on A.


**Constant function**: If the range of a function is a singleton set, then it is called a constant function.

**Identity function**: Let  $f: A \to A$  be a function. If f(x) = x for all  $x \in A$ , then it is called an identity function on A. Identity function on A is usually denoted by  $I_A$ .

**Equal function**: Two functions are said to be equal if f(x) = g(x) for all  $x \in A$ .

Distribution, Diversity and Interrelationship of the Genus Channa (Teleostei: Channidae) in Different Drainage Systems of Mizoram, North East India

#### INTRODUCTION

Fishes of the family Channidae are widely distributed in tropical Africa, parts of the Middle East, and Asia. Though Channidae is only a small family of fishes, the specieslevel diversity is still far from known and the taxonomy of some species groups is obscure (Britz 2013). Myers and Shapovalov (1932) observed that O. gachua was more closely related to Channa orientalis (type species of the genus Channa) than to the other species of Ophicephalus and synonymized the genera Ophicephalus with Channa.

The fishes of the genus Channa are characterized by cylindrical bodies, large mouth, well developed teeth on the jaws, pre-vomer and palatines, long dorsal and anal fin bases, fins with only soft rays and accessory air breathing organs which are modified epibranchials situated in the suprabranchial cavity in the head. These fishes are known to inhabit a wide variety of freshwater habitats ranging from hill streams to derelict swamps (Geetakumari and Vishwanath 2011) and are also able to survive out of water for short periods as they

possess the accessory air breathing organs.

There are currently 35 valid species in the genus out of which 13 species are known to occur in the northeastern part of India (see Vishwanath and Geetakumari 2009; Geetakumari and Vishwanath 2011; Britz 2013; Knight 2016; Lalhlimpuia et al. 2016): Channa amphibeus (McClelland), C. andrao Britz, C. aurantimaculata Musikasinthorn. Channa aurantipectoralis Lalhlimpuia et al, C. barca (Hamilton), C. bleheri Vierke, C. gachua (Hamilton), C. marulius (Hamilton), C. melanostigma Geetakumari and Vishwanath, C. pardalis Knight, C. punctata (Bloch), C. stewartii (Playfair) and C. striata (Bloch).



#### INTRODUCTION

Entomopathogenic nematodes (EPN's) are a group of obligate insect parasites inhabiting the soil, which can infect and kill a broad range of insect hosts (Kava and Gaugler, 1993). They have the ability to actively search and locate their insect host, in response to carbon dioxide, vibration, and other chemical cues (Kaya and Gaugler, 1993), while they remain harmless to other organisms and the environment. EPN species of the genera Steinernema Travassos, 1927, and Heterorhabditis Poinat, 1976 have attracted the attention of entomologists (and of nematologists) for a number of years for use in controlling economically important insect pests. The nematodes and their symbiotic bacteria (Xenorhabdus spp. and Photorhabdus spp. for steinernematids and heterorhabditids, respectively) form a remarkable complex capable of infecting a variety of insect pests (Akhurst, 1993). EPNs in combination with their symbiotic bacteria have the ability to kill an insect host within a short period of time (24 - 48 hours). The free-living infective juveniles when in contact with the host insect enter the body through natural openings (anus, spiracles, mouth) (Georgis and Hague, 1981), penetrate into the hemocoel, and release the symbiotic bacteria that multiply and kill the hosts within 48 hours by septicemia (Burnell and Stock, 2000).

EPNs have been known since the 17th century (Nickle, 1984), but it was only in the 1930s, that serious consideration was given to using a nematode to control an insect.

## CHAPTER 1 AGE OF THE GUPTAS

#### Introduction

The period c.300-600 CE is often referred to as the Gupta period though dynastic labels have no longer found much favour among the historians. After the decline of the Mauryan Empire, various political powers like the Kushanas, the Sakas and the Satavahanas established their rule in India which was followed by political disintegration. The next powerful political power was the Gupta who established their rule on the ruins of the Kushans. They were probably the feudatories of the Kushans and succeeded them without much time lapse. Prayag (modern Allahabad) was the centre of their power from which they spread to the other regions and in course of time became an all-India empire.


The ancestry and early history of the Gupta family are little known. Scholars like RS Sharma and Romila Thapar believe they may have been of vaishya origin while some historians accord them brahman origin. The first important Gupta ruler was Chandragupta I and his accession to the throne in 319-320 CE marked the beginning of the Gupta era. The Gupta Empire was not as large as the Mauryans but it was able to keep north India politically united for more than a century.



## Contribution of British Missionaries in Mizoram towards constructing colonial modernity during the 19th century

#### Emily F. Lalnunpuii

Mizoram, one of the states of North East India was formerly known as Lushai Hills. Since 1826 up to the last decade of the 19th century, when the British expanded their territory to the Chittagong Hill Tracts, the Mizos (inhabitants of Mizoram) frequently raided the territory occupied by the British subjects. This raised the attention of the British Government who made several retaliatory expeditions which were all unfruitful. The first British Indian Army Lushai expedition was sent in 1871-1872 (Woodthorpe 1873) which helped in the virtual domination of the Hills by the British in 1889 (Malsawmdawngliana & Rohmingmawii 2013). This opened the doors for the Christian Missionaries who came to the Lushai Hills and started educating the Mizos thereby paving the way for modernity.

#### Traditional Pre-Christian Mizo ethos

Religion has always been the centre of all activities amongst the traditional Pre-Christian Mizos. Their religion was based on animistic view. They believed in

## Seasonal variations of organic carbon in the sediments of Imphal River, Manipur

The Imphal River is major river in Manipur, India, that connects Manipur River and Bay of Bengal. The seasonal variations of organic carbon in surface sediments and the major sources along the course of the river were studied. Sediment samples were collected from five sampling sites, namely Lamdong Thong (Site 1), Minuthong (Site 2), Sanjenthong (Site 3), Bamon leikial (Site 4) and Singjamel Leishangthem leikial (Site 5), Organic carbon contents were determined using the Walkiey-Back rapid back titration method. It varied considerably in different seasons as well as between different sampling sites. Highest organic carbon was at Site 3 (2.76%) in the winter season, whereas lowest was at Site 4 (1.29%) in the monsoon season. The highest organic carbon at Site 3 may be attributed to large amount of organic matter released from the Sanjenbursh residential area and the cumulative effect of organic matter from municipal deposition in the upstending residential area and the cumulative effect of organic matter from municipal deposition in the upstending the seasonal variation is also partly due to sedimentation of the dissolved and suspended particles found in the river. Site 1 and Site 4 are kept comparatively cleaner. People cultivate crops and they do not dump wastes into river as traditional dumping sites are properly maintained especially at site 1 and 4. Incidentally, lower organic carbon values were recorded from these sites.

## Life-form characteristics and biological spectrum of the aquatic macrophytes in Țam Dil, a natural lake in Mizoram





Tam Dil is a natural lake but reconstructed as fish pond at Saitual, Mizoram. The area around the lake enjoys a moderate climate owing to its tropical location. It receives an adequate amount of rainfall. It is also fed by small streams from surrounding catchment area. During the present investigation, sixteen aquatic macrophytic species were found in the lake. The plants were categorized into submerged, rooted with floating leaves, free-floating, and emergent groups. Life-form of the macrophytic vegetation were determined based on the height, form, habit and nature of the position and degree of protection of the perennating buds together with occurrence of each species in the field. Life-forms were classified as chamaephytes, hemicryptophytes, geophytes, therophytes and errant vascular hydrophytes. Therophytes had the greatest number of species, such as Alternanthera philozeroides, Alternanthera essiles, Brachlaria nutica, Echinochloa stagnino, Kyllinga tenuifolia, Leersia hexandra and Polygonum glabrum. Errant vascular hydrophytes had three species such as Cerotophyllum demersum, Eichhornia crassipes and Marsilea quadrifoliota. Also, three species of hemicryptophytes, namely Commelina bengolensis, Enhydra fluctuons and Hygroryza aristata were identified. Geophytes was represented by Nymphaea pygmaea helvoia and Zizonia lotifolia. Only one species Phragmites karka belong to chamaephytes. Thus, therophytes dominated over the other life-forms classes. Therefore, the lake may be designated as therophytes type of phytoclimate.





Introduction: The global urban population has predominantly become more urban than rural. Cities are important drivers of development and poverty reduction. 

### Geochemistry and nature of protolith of quartz sillimanite schist from Sonapahar area, West Khasi Hills district of Meghalaya

The Precambrian terrain of the Sonapahar area is characterised by the presence of a thin, long, discontinuous band of quartz-sillimanite schist which hosts the massive sillimanite-corundum deposits. The quartz sillimanite schists are generally siliceous, SiO2 (60.59-76.82 wt %) and are characterized by high Al2O3 content with average value (27.22 wt %), low P<sub>2</sub>O<sub>5</sub>, Fe<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub> and MgO, MnO Na<sub>2</sub>O, K<sub>2</sub>O and TiO<sub>2</sub>. Average MgO, CaO, K<sub>2</sub>O and Na2O values are generally less than 0.15 wt %. TiO2 values range from 0.13-0.35 wt %. Compared with the post-Archean metasediments, the Sonapahar schists are richer in SiO2 and Al2O3 but depleted in other oxides. In Harkers variation diagram, SiO2 shows a linear inverse correlation with Al2O3 and TiO2, but there are no significant correlations observed with other oxides. In general, Al<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub> and SiO<sub>2</sub> constitute more than 97 wt % in most of the samples. Among trace elements, Zr, Hf and Pb are characterized by high concentration and low La/Th and Th/U. The schistose rocks are generally low in Sr/Ba ratios (< 0.88 %) and relatively high content of Rb in contrast to Ba. Chondrite normalize REE patterns of the schists reveals a strongly fractionated patterns with enriched LREE and low HREE values [(La/Yb)N = 27.38-43.98] with prominent negative Eu-anomaly. The concentration of V (10.28-51.49) shows the apparent mobility in these quartz sillimanite schists and the oxidizing conditions prevailed during weathering. Geochemical characteristics suggested that quartz sillimanite schists from Sonapahar area are derived from post-Archean recycled upper crust sources and the precursor sediments are possibly derived from felsic rocks and probably not mafic rocks.

### INTRODUCTION

Precambrian basement of the Shillong plateau in Meghalaya, India, is characterised by high grade gneisses which are intruded by basic and ultrabasic rocks of different ages. In Sonapahar area, cordierite bearing granulitic gneisses, basic granulites and quartz sillimanite schists were largely exposed. The Shillong plateau, elsewhere considered a detached Precambrian block of Indian Peninsula in the northeast India is bounded to the south east by E-W trending Dauki fault (Figure 1), to the north by Brahmaputra fault1 or Oldham fault (Bilham and England, 2001) to the west by the broadly NNE-SSW Indo-

Myanmar belt. The plateau is separated from Mikir Hills in the northeast by the alluvium tract of the Kopili fault system (Dasgupta and Nandy, 1982). The demonstrable recognition of Mesoproterozoic granulites in the Shillong Meghalaya Gneissic Complex (SMGC) is new and their similarity with temporally related rocks elsewhere in the Indian shield indicates that the Shillong Plateau has been a part of the Indian shield since the Mesoproterozoic.

Chatterjee et al. (2007) suggested that the Pan-African suture passing through Prydz Bay in Antarctica possibly continued northward into India through the SMGC with the western margin of the suture between the Sonapahar and the Garo-Goalpara Hills regions. The geology of the Shillong plateau is very complex, as the

### Petrography of Barail sandstone of Champhai-Mualkawi section in Champhai district, Mizoram: Implication on provenance and tectonic setting

The area around Champhai district contains exposed Barail Group of rocks (Oligocene) which comprises of buff-coloured sandstones with alternating beds of shale and siltstone. This study focussed on the provenance and tectonic setting of the Barail sandstones with the help of detailed petrographic studies and quantitative and qualitative modal analysis by point counting technique. The general lithological units consist of sandstone, shale, crumpled shale, silty-shale and siltstone. A modal analysis of the 25 sandstone samples was carried out on selected detrital grains like quartz, feldspar and lithic fragments which indicated that quartz ranges between 69.75 to 82.25%, feldspar ranges between 1.80 to 6.91% and lithic fragments ranges between 13.82% to 29.43%. The sandstones belong to sublitharenite, litharenite and feldspathic litharenite indicating predominant presence of quartz in the sandstones with lesser components of feldspar and lithic fragments. Different variants of quartz such as undulatory monocrystalline quartz and polycrystalline quartz and other lithic fragments like schist and gneiss indicate metamorphic source rock. The common occurrence of micas in almost all the sandstone samples may also indicate the common occurrence of mica-bearing metamorphic schists or gneiss in the provenance. Various characteristics of feldspar like strong alteration in orthoclase, deformed twinning of plagioclase and presence of micas may be indicative of low to high grade metamorphic rocks and acidic to basic igneous rocks. On the basis of different tectonic discrimination diagram using QFL and QmFL, the tectono-provenance of the sandstones was found to be Quartzose Recycled Orogen. It is concluded that the source area might be the tectonically active continent-continent collision zone of eastern Himalaya and the Indo-Burmese belt and that the associated extrusive and intrusive igneous rocks are prone to weathering and erosion by various denudation processes.

### INTRODUCTION

Petrography of sedimentary rocks reveal the nature of source rock of the region and tectonic settings of the sedimentary basins. Several geological investigations have been carried out by different workers in Mizoram. The geochemistry and petrographic characteristics of Muthi sandstones of Upper Bhuban Formation have indicated that the rock belongs to Litharenite (Lalmuankimi et al., 2011). Based on petrographic modal analyses Lalnunmawia and Lalhlimpuii (2014) concluded that the current sandstones are sublitharenite to litharenite having provenance of recycled orogeny.

Provenance studies received new impulses through the work of Dickinson (1970), who established clear cut operational definitions for grain types to improve the reproducibility of detrital modes. Subsequently, Dickin-

### Effects of frequency parameter due to elastic wave in monoclinic elastic medium

The propagation of elastic waves has many applications especially in geophysics and engineering. They are used in the detection of notches and faults in different types of materials such as in railway tracks, buried landmines, seismic activities, and exploration of valuable materials such as minerals, crystals, natural gas, etc. When the seismic signal passes through different discontinuities inside the earth, the phenomena of reflection and transmission takes place. In this paper, the phenomenon of reflection and transmission of elastic waves due to incident qSV-wave at a corrugated interface between two different monoclinic elastic half-spaces are discussed. There exist an irregularly reflected and transmitted waves due to undulated nature of the interface, besides the regularly reflected and transmitted ones. Using Rayleigh's method of approximation, the expressions for the reflection and transmission coefficients of the regular and irregular waves are obtained. It is observed that these coefficients are functions of angle of incidence and elastic constants and they are greatly influenced by the frequency and corrugation parameter. For a special type of interface, x3 = d cos px2 we have computed these coefficients and discussed the effects of frequency parameter.

### INTRODUCTION

Elastic wave propagation is a very interesting topic that deals with numerous problems in various fields such as earthquake engineering, geophysics, signal processing, echography and metallurgy. They are useful in detection of notches and faults in different types of materials such as in railway tracks, buried land-mines, etc. The technique of seismic wave propagation is a tool for investigating the internal structure of the earth and also used for exploration of valuable materials such as minerals, crystals, fluids (oils, water) etc. beneath the earth surface. When the seismic signal passes through different discontinuities inside the earth, the phenomena of reflection and transmission takes place. These signals carry lots of information about the earth's structures and many such problems are in open literatures, i.e. Chattopadhyay and Choudhury (1995), Chattopadhyay et al.

(1995), Singh (1999), Singh and Khurana (2002), Udias (1999) and others.

Singh and Khurana (2001) investigated the reflection and transmission of P and SV-waves at the interface between two monoclinic elastic half-spaces. Singh and Tomar (2007) investigated the problem of qP-waves at a corrugated interface between two dissimilar monoclinic elastic half-spaces and obtained the reflection and transmission coefficients of the irregular waves using Rayleigh's technique. 

### Chapter1

### Transformation of Co-ordinates and Invariants

### 1.1 Transformation of Co-ordinate:

A point in a two-dimensional coordinate system is determined by a pair of numbers which depends on the position of axes. If the co-ordinate axes are changed by shifting the origin or by rotating the axes or by both, then the co-ordinate of the point i.e. the equation of a locus will be changed. These processes are known as transformation of co-ordinates.

### 1.2 Change of Origin without change of Direction of Axes:

Let (x, y) be the co-ordinate of P with respect to rectangular axes OX and OY after shifting the origin O at the point (h, k) of O' the new co-ordinate of the point P becomes (x', y') referred to the new set of axes O'X' and O'Y' which are parallel to the original axes OX and OY respectively.

We have

 $x' = O'N'$ ,  $y' = N'P$   
 $h = OT'$  and  $k = O'T'$   
Now  $x = ON = OT' + T'\Lambda$

This transformation is known as transformation formulae for translation of axes.

Note: In the equation of locus reffered to original system of axes (x, y) will be replaced by (x' + h, y' + k) when the equation is reffered to new pair of axes. Inversely (x', y') will be replaced by (x-h, y-k).



### Background



### 1.0 Introduction

Cancer is a term used for diseases in which abnormal cells divide without control and are able to invade other tissues. Cancer cells can spread to other parts of the body through the blood and lymph systems.

Cancer is not just one disease but many diseases. There are more than 100 different types of cancer. Most cancers are named for the organ or type of cell in which they start – for example, cancer that begins in the colon is called colon cancer; cancer that begins in melanocytes of the skin is called melanoma.

Cancer is the leading cause of death in economically developed countries and the second leading cause of death in developing countries (WHO 2008). The burden of cancer is increasing in economically developing countries as a result of population aging and growth as well as, increasingly, an adoption of cancer-associated lifestyle choices including smoking, physical inactivity (WHO 2008).

### 1.1. Cancer in World

In 2013, WHO launched the Global Action Plan for the Prevention and Control of Non-communicable Diseases 2013-2020 that aims to reduce by 25% premature mortality from cancer, cardiovascular diseases, diabetes and chronic respiratory diseases by 2025. Some of the voluntary targets are most relevant for cancer prevention, including target 5 aimed at reducing the prevalence of tohacco use by 30%.

According to world cancer report 2014, approximately 14 million new cases were diagnosed and 8.2 million cancer related deaths in 2012. The number of new cases is expected to rise by about 70% over the next 2 decades. Among men, lung, prostate, colorectum, stornach, and liver cancer were very common. Among women the 5 most common sites diagnosed were breast, colorectum, lung, cervix, and stornach cancer.







The main factors for the instability of this area stems from t intersection of two sets of joints dividing the rock beds into varying dimensions and the presence of bedding shears and clay pockets/beds with swelling and shrinkage properties, decrease in the shear strength of overburden and bed rocks during rainy season due to water saturation and erosion of shaly layer by scouring action and a high hill slope. Remedial measures such as; lined catch water drains and chute for channeling surface water flow along the hill slope; lining of side drain to prevent toe erosion and also to prevent water percolation through debris. Sealing/filling of ground fractures/cracks with clayey material; breast and retaining structures to prevent toe erosion are suggested.

### 13 Mizo identity

The role of the Young Mizo Association (YMA) in Mizoram

N. William Singh

Young Mizo Association or YMA (hereafter called simply the Association) is the largest NGO in Mizoram with a membership of more than 400,000 members. Although calling itself a social organisation that exists to serve the needy, its activities promote the awareness of Mizo identity through notions of shared history, shared religion, shared culture and shared rituals. It organises community services and cultural events on a regular basis, which it utilises effectively to impart a sense of 'Mizo-ness' to its members. A particular feature of the YMA in contrast to associations in other communities or other parts of India is that membership is compulsory for all Mizos.

This chapter aims at analysing the central role of the YMA in promoting awareness and moulding ethnic identity through everyday social activities. This first shows that the activities of the YMA are not limited to the declared aims of the association; this further demonstrates that although the leaders of the association claim that it is a purely non-political organisation, some of its activities have explicit political overtones.


The differences between the written rules of the YMA constitution and the actual practices of the association will be detailed in the first section. The second section explores both the positive aspects and the problematic roles of the Association as regards the other communities in the state of Mizoram. First, the promotion of volunteerism through community service, linked to the traditional Mizo practices of *Tlawmgaihna* and *Hnatlang*, and the significant roles of Central Young Mizo Association (CYMA),<sup>2</sup> especially regarding the promotion of traditional dress and festivals, will be discussed. Members of the YMA also seek to develop an awareness of a distinct ethnic identity among Mizos through the promotion or organisation of everyday practices as well as events bearing social and cultural significance. This section also examines the problematic role of CYMA in supporting compulsory Mizo language, besides English and Hindi, in the school curriculum since Mizoram became a full-fledged state of the Indian Union in 1987. This policy of promoting the dominant language

### A STUDY ON THE WATER QUALITY STATUS OF CHITE RIVER, AIZAWL, MIZORAM

### Introduction

Rivers are very important sources of water. Water from rivers are utilized for variety of purposes in agriculture, industry, transportation, aquaculture, public water supply etc. Since time immemorial, river waters are used by people for different day to day domestic utility. Water is also an essential natural resource which humanity cannot live without it. Freshwater ecosystems are considered as one the most important natural resources for the survivability of all the living organisms of the biosphere. Freshwater habitats are of much importance to mankind but they occupy a relatively small portion of the earth's surface as compared to the marine and terrestrial habitats (Santra, 2012). It is the availability of water which determines the nature, composition and abundance of terrestrial life. Over exploitation, misuse and pollution of water are responsible for making it scarce and unfit for consumption. The mounting problems of the degradation of our rivers has necessitated regular monitoring of our freshwater resources like our rivers (Das & Sinha, 1993). This will help to identify the ecological health status of the water bodies.

In the early time, Chite river is an important river that provides freshwater needed for irrigation and other agriculture purposes. But, due to increase at population, rapid urbanization and disposal of municipal waste water, efficients sewage from diffused sources leads to the pollution of the Chite river. River health is directly related to their physical, chemical and biological integrity. Water quality evaluation leads to information about their misuse by indicating the pollution status. Since the quality of aquatic life depends on the water quality, a thorough assessment of the water quality is important. It is essential to carry out the present
